Welcome to The University of Utah's Scholarship Management Site!

Various colleges, departments and offices throughout the University of Utah offer the scholarships listed. Click "Show Filters" to display filter options such as college or major, or use the "Search" box to find scholarships by keyword or name. Select the scholarship name to learn more about the opportunity; see below for further details. Keep in mind that **Internet Explorer 11 (IE 11) is not fully compatible with Academic Works**; for optimal compatibility, sign in using any newer browser, for example: Microsoft Edge, Google Chrome, Mozilla Firefox or Apple Safari.

Helpful Hints:

- **To Sign in:** Click Sign In in the top right of this screen, and on the next screen you will use your University of Utah sign in credentials. Upon signing in the first time, complete your General Application. Depending on your major you may be prompted to complete a Conditional Application which is required for scholarships in your major or area of study. Once you complete the General Application (and Conditional Application, if applicable), scholarships that are currently "open" will be recommended to you if you meet the basic criteria. Please keep in mind that being recommended does not constitute meeting the qualifications. You can update and edit any application (including the General Application) until the scholarship opportunity closes.
- Scholarships with the word "apply" in the Action column (after you sign in) require further action on your part in order to be considered. Click "apply" to complete the application process. Please read the scholarship eligibility requirements carefully to make sure you meet the eligibility requirements (e.g. major, GPA, enrollment requirement to receive the scholarship, other requirements as stated) before applying.
- **IF YOU ARE EXPERIENCING ISSUES UPLOADING A FILE:** If you are asked to upload a resume, letter of support, or any other supporting documentation, please know that the system will not allow for punctuation (commas, apostrophes and periods) to be used in the file name (example of what is not allowed: John.Doe, Resume,2020). Using punctuation will cause an error in trying to upload any of these supporting documents. Rename any file that includes these and don't forget to click "Save and Keep Editing" after you select the file you wish to upload. Clicking "Finish and Submit" will submit your completed application for consideration.
- There are some scholarship opportunities for which you do not have to apply, but will instead be automatically matched after you complete your General Application (and Conditional Application if there is one). Qualifying for any scholarship does not guarantee you will receive the scholarship.

The scholarship amount awarded may vary from the amount listed, based on the availability of funds. Disbursement of all awards is also subject to availability of funds.

The General Application you completed will be on file until August of each year. You must complete a new General Application at the beginning of every fall semester.



Application Process

To apply for College of Engineering Scholarships:

- Go to Academic Works
- Complete the General Application
- Complete the College of Engineering application
 - This will automatically match you with scholarships
- Complete recommended “apply-to” scholarships
 - Once you finish the College of Engineering application you will be shown recommended scholarship opportunities. When you see a scholarship that you are interested in, click apply, and you will find the application.

Tip: upload documents as a pdf and without any punctuation in the name of the document.

Need-Based Scholarships

You **MUST** fill out a FAFSA to be considered for need-based scholarships.



Personal Statement & Essays

Do

- Answer each question
 - Make sure you are answering the question being asked.
- Elaborate on why you are passionate about engineering
- Write about future educational/career goals
- Tell us about research, clubs, or other ways you have gone the extra mile to be involved
 - If you have been unable to participate in activities outside of class, tell us how the scholarship funds will enable you to become more involved.
- **We want to understand you and your story!**

Don't

- Copy and paste from your personal statement to your essays.
 - We will see!
- Have spelling/ grammar mistakes
- Only write a sentence
- Be generic
 - “I have always loved math & science.”
 - Try to make your answers unique and specific to you.

Resume

Some scholarships require a resume. Here are some tips:

- Along with work and internship experience, include
 - Research
 - extracurricular activities (ex: clubs)
 - Volunteer work
 - Class projects
- Appearance
 - Show us that you put effort into the formatting!

References

Early bird gets the worm!

Ask for references as soon as possible! Professors may not be able to accommodate last minute requests.

Engineering and other STEM professors are best for a reference.

Do not list someone as a reference without asking them first!

Remember: faculty are not required to be references for students, they do this as a favor to you. Please be kind and gracious: this is an ask, not a demand.

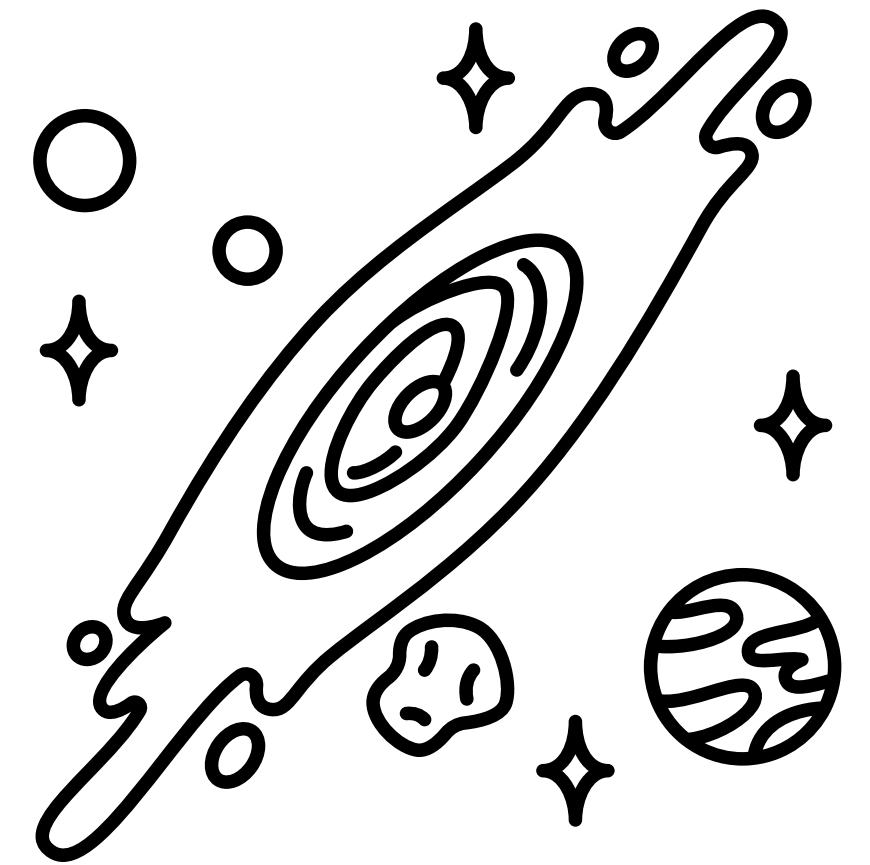
Tip: you may want to ask for more than you need (for two references ask three).
